- Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)
- Must be typed
- Be written by an individual and not a group

- Be prose, not rap or poem

Stories must not:

- Give any personal details of the child, including their name
- Recount an historical event (but they can use a real person or historical character as a source of inspiration)

All stories will be judged on the following criteria:

- Characterisation
- Plot
- Originality
- Language
- Enjoyment

The deadline to submit entries is on 8th November so please email them to your class teach or directly to me by **Tuesday 5th November.** You can also enter your child's story in at home too (just let the class teacher know it has been entered).

It would be fantastic if we had more children short listed this year!

History Research: Black History Month 2024

Online Safety – Parent Talk and Workshop for KS2

Last Friday, we were pleased to welcome Mary Rebelo into school to talk to parents and run online safety workshops for children in KS2. Mary is an Online Safety Ambassador for CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection Agency) as well as an Online Safety Officer for the London Borough of Camden.

In the parent talk, Mary discussed with parents what their primary concerns were when their children were online. She explained the rules and legislation by which companies are bound and the differences between games which are 8 plus, 13 plus and 16 plus.

Her approach was that we need to be open and honest with our children about the risks of the online world (without being alarmist). At the same time, she also emphasised the positive side of the internet.

The workshop also provided a good opportunity for parents to discuss with each other and there was an open forum for questions.

- Year 6 students have been studying World War II and the impact of propaganda posters. They've created their own posters, which will be proudly displayed soon for everyone to admire.


We can't wait to share these wonderful projects with you, so keep an eye out for our upcoming displays!













Year 1

Year 1 have been learning about measuring length this week. We started by ordering items and sorting them according to their length. We started by measuring classroom objects and rooms using non-standard units, our strides and hands. We then measured different classroom items, using cubes as standard units. Did you know a Year 1 desk is 32 cubes tall? In the afternoon, a group of Year 1's took on the challenge of measuring our classroom using cubes.

Mathematics at Saint Christina's

One of the important aspects of learning in Mathematics at Saint Christina's is the study of Geometry. Fairly early on we learn about the names of different shapes, both 2D and 3D.

And although we can all recognise and use such shapes (e.g., a Toblerone packet is actually a triangular prism!), we need to know and understand about their properties in greater depth. One way of doing this is to look at how many faces, edges and vertices (corners) each shape has. Year Three has recently been doing some interesting work on this, by discovering or making up their own theories about the properties of such shapes.







But back to business! You will see from the pictures of shapes above, that we would really welcome it if you had any spare empty packets or containers that you could give us, so that children will be handling and investigating such shapes to greater effect.

Should you have any such shapes – the more unusual the better, of course! – then do please put them in a bag with my name on it. I will then see to it that these shapes get shared out among the classes at the appropriate time!

REMINDERS

NUT FREE SCHOOL

We have a number of pupils and staff in the school who have serious nut allergies. Please will you ensure that you do not give your child any nuts or nut products (e.g., Nutella) to bring into school.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Please do not send your child into school with any medication on their person. Medication can only be administered by qualified personnel. The only medication that we can administer, therefore, is prescribed medication e.g., Antibiotics, Inhalers, EpiPen's. Children should not be sent into school with any other type of medication e.g., Cold and Flu medicines / Calpol / Lozenges etc. If your child is unwell and in need of medication, they should remain at home until they feel better.

If your child does have any medication, please contact Miss Georgia, and she will ask you to fill in the relevant forms and keep the medication safely in the School Office. Thank you for your co-operation.

Late collection of children

Please be aware that if you enrol one child into a club and need to put another in Homework club, there is a charge of £15 for the session. This is necessary to cover the costs of staffing the provision. Additionally, children who are collected late at the end of the school day or after a club will be sent to Homework Club and parents will be charged accordingly. Homework Club runs from Monday to Thursday from 3.30-5.00pm and costs £15 per session. A late fee of £50 is charged if children are collected after 5.00pm which is when the school officially closes for the end of the day.

Parking

Whilst we are delighted to see that Westminster have finally awarded us a keep clear school zone at the front entrance, we note that the parking regime has been updated on the Camden side of the road to include more double yellow lines. Please be aware that we expect enforcement to be vigilant and encourage you to park safely and with consideration for our neighbours in areas where stopping is permitted.

Items left in the front office

Please ensure that your child has everything they need for the school day before they arrive in the morning: e.g., snacks / PE Kit. Items are regularly being left in the office by parents and carers throughout the day and, whilst they will do everything, they can to help you, this causes disruption not only to the office staff but also to the children, Class Teachers and TAs who have to come to the office to collect the items. Thank you in advance for your support in this matter.

Sunday Mass

Just a reminder to everyone, you are all invited to join Sunday Mass, which is held in the Chapel at 10.00am

Safety around drop-off

A polite reminder – if you are dropping your child off for breakfast club or a morning music lesson, **your child must** be supervised until the doors open at 8.00am and under no circumstances left unattended.

Retrieving forgotten items

For practical and safety reasons it is not always possible for children to return to school to retrieve forgotten items e.g., homework, snack boxes, coats etc. Once school has finished, the teachers either use their classroom for meetings or the classrooms may be empty with no one there to supervise your child whilst they are on the premises. It is rare that any oversight will be seminal and that there will be drastic repercussions should anything be temporarily irretrievable. Any belongings left in classrooms can be collected the next day during regular school hours.
